

INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON THE PROTECTION OF PERSONS UNDER SPECIAL ADMINISTRATIVE PROTECTION

The International Conference on the Protection of Persons under Special Administrative Protection was held in Geneva, Switzerland, from 19 to 23 October 1991.

The Conference was organized by the International Commission on the Protection of Persons under Special Administrative Protection, which was established by the United Nations General Assembly in 1987. The Commission's mandate is to study and report on the situation of persons under special administrative protection and to recommend measures for their protection.
